January Council Seminar Series Event - Motivational Interviewing to Evoke Behavioral Change



The basics of Motivational Interviewing include how to minimize resistance, how to evoke "change talk," how to explore and resolve ambivalence, and how to use the person's own perspective to amplify the discrepancy between their present behavior and their broader goals and values.

Martha Stewart, Child Welfare Research and Training Project, Department of Human Development and Family Studies, will show us how this universal technique can be used with anyone - including your co-workers, family members, students, friends, and supervisors - you name it!

Join us January 8 in the Gallery Room of the Memorial Union to explore how Motivational Interviewing can be used to help someone identify and work through their own reasons for making a behavioral change.

Workplace Accommodations: Be mindful of the needs of employees with disabilities

The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requires employers to provide reasonable accommodations to allow employees with disabilities to do their jobs.



Individuals with physical or mental disabilities who are otherwise qualified to perform their work may request reasonable accommodations to enable them to work.

A reasonable accommodation is changes to a position or workplace that will enable a qualified employee to perform their essential job functions; for example, modifying the height of a desk or restructuring a job's hours or location.

Employees should complete the <u>Disability Accommodation Request</u> and submit it to their supervisor.

Employees may seek assistance from the Office of Equal Opportunity, University Human Resources, or the Iowa State University Ombuds Office.
