So, how are you doing? If you need help, take advantage of university mental health services available

As the COVID-19 pandemic worsens and other events continue to impact the lives and outlook of many, lowa State University has seen an increase in individuals reaching out for mental health assistance. During a recent lowa Board of Regents meeting university chief of police Michael Newton reported the department has seen a significant increase in mental health calls on the part of students, including a huge increase in suicide ideation.



Professional and Scientific Council realizes that mental health assistance is also a need for university staff.

Tim Ashley, interim assistant vice president of payroll and taxes, has shared information with Professional and Scientific Council that shows a 32.11% increase in paid mental health-related claims for ISU staff in the current year to date when compared with the previous year to date. Figures also show mental health has moved from third to second in the past year for the most frequent medical diagnosis with allowed insurance charges.

Professional and Scientific Council would like to remind all P&S staff that mental health resources are available to you through the university.

In-person help in the form of free, confidential counseling services is available with the Employee Assistance Program (EAP) through Employee & Family Resources (EFR). The program is available not only to employees but to members of an employee's immediate family. Visit the EFR login page or learn more about EFR's counseling offerings. You can also view an EAP Benefit Summary or call 800-327-4692, 24 hours a day, seven days a week to speak to a representative who can answer questions and provide guidance.



The Employee and Family Resources program also offers <u>webinars</u> on many subjects dealing with mental health awareness, with several current offerings focusing on such things as staying connected in a socially distanced world, stress and burnout and emotional support for those impacted by COVID-19.

If you are in need of assistance, Professional and Scientific Council urges you to take advantage of these services available.

Did you know? The SHOP Food Pantry is available for staff, faculty and students; volunteers for staffing are sought



Did you know there is a food pantry available to all ISU students, staff and faculty right on campus? The SHOP (Students Helping Our Peers) is an entirely student run organization with a mission to engage with anti-hunger advocates and serve the student population by increasing hunger awareness and food security. Their pantry location is 1306 Beyer Hall, and their hours throughout winter session and break will be Tuesdays and Fridays from 10 a.m.-2 p.m.

To utilize the SHOP, clients should go to their Beyer Hall location where they will fill out a digital grocery list which is based on their available inventory. For those without a device to access the digital list, paper copies are available when you get there. Volunteers working the SHOP will then receive an email regarding your order, fulfill it and hand you the bagged items. There are personal care items available for clients to take while they await their order fulfillment.

What can you do to help? Spread awareness! Please educate fellow staff and students about this resource on campus in case they or someone they know are in need. Staff and faculty who are able to support the SHOP may volunteer to work one-hour shifts over the break. Due to COVID-19 restrictions the SHOP is currently not accepting food donations, but you can make a financial contribution to help support their activities.
