Did you know? ISU's Van Pool may offer a more cost-effective way to get to work

If you're looking for an alternate way to commute to work, ISU Transportation Services may have the answer.

The department provides university-owned vans to groups of employees for the purpose of getting to and from work on campus. One member drives and is responsible for the van; others pay a monthly fee to support the operating cost. The cost for riders varies by van.



Full-time Professional and Scientific employees who work regular hours can take advantage of the van pool. Benefits include less wear and tear on your vehicle, less expense than driving alone, freedom to work, read, relax, or socialize while riding safely, ten free one-day parking passes for driving a personal vehicle, and free emergency rides home if needed.

Currently, there are van stops in Ankeny, Jefferson, Ogden, Boone, Urbandale and Des Moines. ISU Transportation Services is always open to adding more communities if the need is there.
