A great way to become more engaged with our Professional and Scientific colleagues at Iowa State is to connect through the Professional and Scientific Council's Interest Groups. This fall we will highlight two interest groups: "P3: Pollinators, Plants, and People" and "Fitness and Fun!"

P3: Pollinators - In September monarch butterflies will begin their 2,500 mile migration to Mexico. The Professional and Scientific Council Peer Advocacy Committee announces that the Interest Group (IG) P3: Pollinators, Plants and People will kick off the fall semester by tagging monarch butterflies September 14, noon to 1 p.m., and at 4:30-5:30 p.m. at the Plant Iowa Beautiful pollinator habitat.

This habitat was planted at the bioswale on the northeast side of the Biorenewables Complex on Bissell Road through a grant from Alliant Energy Foundation and Keep Iowa Beautiful.
