Professional and Scientific employees are elected each spring to represent their constituents on council from each of Iowa State's <u>four divisions</u>: Academic Affairs, Student Affairs, Operations and Finance, and the President's Office. Because of its size, the division of Academic Affairs is further divided into smaller representation areas, primarily populated by individual colleges, Extension and Outreach and Ames National Laboratory, among others.

Professional and Scientific Council works best when we hear from our constituents! We encourage you to be in touch with <u>the councilors who represent you</u> to offer feedback, share concerns, and ask questions. Email is a great way to start those conversations with your councilors. We also welcome our constituents at our monthly general meetings. Upcoming meeting dates are: September 1, October 6, November 3, and December 1, beginning at 2:10 p.m. in the Memorial Union.

Your feedback and concerns drive Professional and Scientific Council's annual strategic initiatives. At the September meeting Professional and Scientific Council will hold a second read <u>of the 2022-2023 strategic</u> <u>initiatives</u> to finalize them. The strategic initiatives influence the advocacy<u>Professional and Scientific</u> <u>Council pursues</u>. This has included flexible working arrangements, stronger supervisor support for better employee outcomes, and yearly recommendations for compensation and benefits.

Did you know? Ombuds service has returned to Iowa State with hiring of Laura Smythe

Iowa State University resumed its ombuds service in April, 2022 with the hiring of new university ombuds Laura Smythe.

Smythe has an extensive background in ombuds work and conflict resolution. Most recently she served as university ombuds at the University of Idaho, Moscow. Since 2003 she has also run her own firm providing consulting in organizational culture and conflict resolution. She has served as the director of the Mediation Center of Greater Green Bay and has worked as a private practice attorney.

lowa State's ombuds services are independent, neutral, and confidential for faculty, Professional and Scientific and merit staff, postdoctoral scholars, and graduate and professional students. The services are an informal resource for employees and not meant to replace an employee's ability and responsibility to speak with their supervisor to informally resolve issues.



Staff may contact Laura about topics such as individual and group conflicts, group dynamics, concerns about implementation/application of policies, <u>trainings</u>, and coaching. Note that trainings is a new option not previously offered by the Ombuds Office.
